

Snohomish County 4-H Horse Program Fall Performance Show Entry Information & Rules

Evergreen Equestrian Park Monroe, WA October 3 - 5, 2025

Please Note: When you sign the entry form – you are indicating that you have read these rules. Read all forms completely for updates & changes – Ask questions if you need clarification.

ENTRY FORM INFORMATION

Please be sure that your completed entry form has the following items included:

- Entry includes Parent or Legal Guardian signature and Exhibitor signature. Parent's signature is required regardless of the exhibitor's age. You will not be able to pick up your Exhibitor number if both signatures are not included.
- Full payment for all classes must be paid at time of registration. Make checks payable to: Snohomish County 4-H Horse Program. There will be a \$15 minimum charge on any NSF/returned checks. Online payments accepted information is on entry form. **If entry is not paid with pre-entry, post-entry fees will apply.**
- **Refer to Show Entry form for important Pre-Entry and Post-Entry dates and class fees.**
- If you do not know your Danish Ribbon or Medal standing, contact the Show Registrar for a copy of your record. You may also ask for a Danish Ribbon report at the show office.
- Post Entries will be accepted **Friday and Saturday evenings between 6-8pm and between 7am and 10:30 am both mornings.**
- **Showmanship must be pre-entered or post-entered by 8 pm the evening prior** in all arenas for both days. For Saturday Showmanship, classes must be entered by **8pm on Friday**. For Sunday Showmanship, classes must be entered by **8pm Saturday**.
- **Registration for all classes each day will be closed at 10:30 am.** Please be sure to register for all classes before 10:30 am.
- **Remember that the only equines a member may exhibit are their project animals!**

PARKING INFORMATION

- Haul-in is from 4pm-9:30pm on Friday and Saturday. Daytime haul-in begins at 6am on Saturday and Sunday.
- **If you park in an RV space, you will be charged the RV fee.** RV camping is available at a cost of \$30.00 (no hookups) per space per day/night and/or \$35.00 (with hookups). RV prices are established by the Fairgrounds and are subject to change with no warning. Display the RV pass that you receive from the parking attendant in your RV window.
- Cars are to park as indicated by parking personnel and may not park in front of horse trailers or in the horse trailer area. Cars parked in "NO PARKING" or "FIRE LANE" areas may be towed. Please be respectful of signs and volunteers.
- **Dogs, (except certified service dogs on a short leash) are not allowed inside the Equestrian Park gates at 4-H Events. Dogs must be confined appropriately in the Equestrian Parking Area outside the barn area.**

BARN AND STALL INFORMATION

- Late arrivals after the barns close are not allowed.
- Wash racks will close at 8:00 pm to allow adequate time for horses to be dry prior to barns closing at 10pm.
- The barns close on Sunday 45 minutes after the last class is placed. You are expected to have all belongings and your horse removed in a timely manner.
- Horse stalls are to be properly maintained. This includes:
 - Removal of manure and soiled shavings and replenishing shavings as needed.
 - Keep wheelbarrows and stall equipment out of traffic areas.
 - All horses need two properly secured buckets of water (Small Equines may have only one)
- Members are required to fill, strip, and sweep their own stalls so bring appropriate tools. All shavings must be removed to the used shavings bunkers.
 - Stalls that are not properly maintained throughout the weekend and thoroughly cleaned will result in that member losing stall services at future shows.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- The current issues of the Snohomish County 4-H Horse Program County Reference Guide and the Washington State 4-H Equine Rule Book shall be followed. In cases where State Rule Book and/or Snohomish County 4-H rules do not cover a topic in question, we will refer to USEF current rulebook for clarification.
- **JUDGES' DECISIONS IN ALL CLASSES ARE FINAL.**
- SEI/ASTM approved Equestrian Helmets must be worn by all riders/drivers whenever mounted.
- Only Snohomish County 4-H members may ride/drive at this show.
- Exhibitor's AGE as of October 1 of the current 4-H year (October 1, 2025) determines the age group for the show.
 - **Juniors** - ages 8 through 10
 - **Intermediates** - ages 11 through 13
 - **Seniors** - ages 14 through 18
- Awards: Rosette Ribbons to 8th place in all classes.
- Selected Patterns will be posted no later than the morning of the show and usually the evening prior.
- No cross entry between Regular level and Medals/Advanced level in any classes, with the exception of Saddleseat, in which you can cross enter between both regular equitation and medals equitation class. You must ride these classes at your current level.
- **Show results will be posted the week following the show. Check your results and notify the Show Registrar within 3 weeks if there are any discrepancies. After 3 weeks the results will be archived and final.**

SHOWMANSHIP

- There will be two arenas running each morning for Showmanship.
- Both arenas will start promptly at the times published on the Class list.
- You must enter the highest level obtained. e .g. If you receive your third Blue Danish award on Saturday and plan on entering Showmanship on Sunday, you will be required to show in the Bronze Medal Showmanship Class.
- **Showmanship must be pre-entered in all arenas for both days. Saturday Showmanship classes must be entered by Friday at 8pm. Sunday Showmanship classes must be entered by Saturday at 8pm.**

TRAIL

- Trail patterns will be posted at the trail arena by 8am
- All changes to trail classes must be approved by the show office by 10:30 am.
- Check the show schedule for trail course hours and plan your day accordingly. It is your responsibility to complete the course as early as possible to ensure you have the chance to participate and so that placings can be completed and returned to you in a timely manner.
- If you receive your third Blue Danish award in Regular Trail on Saturday and plan on entering Trail on Sunday, you will be required to show in the Bronze Medal Trail Class.
- All Trail results will be tabulated and posted as close to 5:30 pm as possible.
- If you are unable to remain at the show and want to obtain your trail placing/ribbon, you must **contact Sarah Henricksen** to make those arrangements. Sarah may be reached at 425 736 2165 or sar12_107@yahoo.com
- Each horse/rider combination may only enter one trail class and the rider may not enter the same trail class with a different horse. Members may only enter a second trail class if one class is with a regular horse and the second is a greenhorse in a Greenhorse class or if one trail class is a ridden trail, then a second in-hand class could be entered as long as the classes are completed with two different project horses, e.g. Riding a horse in mounted Trail and doing In - hand Trail with a miniature. Exception is if a member is riding a "Small Equine" then they may enter both Ridden Trail and In Hand Trail with the same Equine.
- **Registration for all trail classes will close at 10:30 am. Please be sure to register as early as possible.**

GREENHORSE

- Only Regular Riders may show Greenhorses (of any type). Once you have shown a Greenhorse, you will always be a Regular Rider. Greenhorses may not cross enter with any class not listed as "Greenhorse". Bits may be checked in Greenhorse classes. Check the Green Horse Rules and ask the Show Steward for clarification on any bit questions.
- Beginning Greenhorse is for the horse that is not ready to canter/lope in a Horsemanship class. No cross entry with any other type of class. Members may ride in only one Greenhorse Horsemanship Class per day.
- **Beginning Greenhorses and Greenhorses may enter into the Green Horse Trail Ridden class.**
- Longe Line class is for horses up to age 5 that have never been shown under saddle. No cross entry with any riding class.

ADVANCED BAREBACK

- Advanced Bareback is for Intermediate and Senior regular level riders. Once you earn three Blue Danish ribbons in Regular Bareback you will be moved up to this advanced level class and can no longer enter Regular Bareback.

DISCIPLINED RAIL

- Disciplined Rail is an Equitation Class performed as a group. Open to regular and medals riders only.
- Class may include: extended trot, pivot, drop stirrups, mount & dismount, counter canter, halt, sidepass, etc.
- Disciplined Rail has separate classes for Intermediate and Senior Riders. Please enter appropriate class.
- **Disciplined Rail placings do not count in the determination of High Point or Reserve High Point awards.**

NOVICE

- Novice Rider to be novice for all classes in that seat.
- Novice classes are for the rider (not the horse) who has not won three Blue Danish ribbons in Novice Equitation. **Riders with prior horse show experience (breed, zone, Pony Club, etc.) should not enter Novice Classes.**

WALK/TROT OR JOG

- Walk/Trot or Jog Riders to be Walk/Trot or Jog for all classes in that seat.
- Walk/Trot or Jog classes are for the rider (not the horse) who has not won four Blue Danish ribbons in Walk/Trot or Jog **Equitation** at a County Show or Fair or one "regular" Blue Danish ribbon in Equitation in that seat. **Riders with prior horse show experience (breed, zone, Pony Club, etc.) should not enter Walk/Trot/Jog Classes.**

Hunter Over Fences

- Riders must be "Regular" status in Performance to compete in HOF classes. No Walk/Trot or Novice riders or Green Horses.
- No cross entry of horse/rider between Cross Pole, 2' and 2'6" divisions.
- Medal Riders must qualify by receiving 3 Blue Danish Ribbons in Regular 2'6" Equitation Over Fences Classes.
- At least one warm up jump will be provided in a warm up arena and accessible only for HOF entered rider's use. An adult must be present to supervise warm up jumps.
- To compete in Hunter Over Fences Classes at Fair, horse/rider must participate successfully in a HOF class at the same level entered at Fair.

HIGH POINT AWARDS

- High points and reserve high points will be awarded in each age group (Junior, Intermediate, and Senior) in all divisions
- You can only receive HP in either Huntseat OR Saddleseat classes but you must declare which HP you want your Showmanship, Bareback Equitation, and Trail points to count towards. Only classes shown in Saddleseat tack and attire shall count toward Saddleseat Highpoint. Only classes shown in Huntseat tack and attire shall count toward Huntseat Highpoint.
- Highpoint tie-breakers = 1. Showmanship, 2. Equitation (or Reinsmanship) 3. Trail 4. Bareback Equitation (or Precision) • ♣ Classes on schedule shown with a ♣ do not count toward High Point awards.

PLATINUM MEDALS –

Congratulations on making Platinum Level! Your hard work has paid off and now it is time to have some fun and showcase what you and your horse are best at!

- The allotted time for platinum patterns is a total of eight minutes. This includes set-up, reviewing pattern with Judge, music, completing your pattern, and cleaning up/removing any props used for your performance.

- If you would like to test your music (and we highly recommend that!) please do so the night before your class or before 7:15am. We cannot guarantee what type of sound system the ESF will have so please be prepared with your own equipment.
- All patterns are to be designed and turned in on a comment sheet provided by the show office. You can pick up a blank sheet during show office hours and blank trail course forms will be available at trail.
- All Platinum patterns must be turned in prior to the class for approval.
- **Showmanship and Equitation patterns must be turned in at the show office by 8am each morning.**
- **Trail patterns are to be turned in by 12:00 (noon) to the Trail Coordinator at the trail arena.** Trail patterns must be different for each day (English pattern must be different than western pattern). Platinum patterns must contain certain maneuvers and also will be judged on difficulty level (must be more difficult than Gold Medal Patterns)

GATE HOLDS

An exhibitor may request a gate hold with the show manager for equipment or clothing change, etc.. The advisability of holding a class and the length of time permitted will be at the discretion of Show Management.

SHARING HORSES

A shared project horse is defined as only immediate family members or two non-family members sharing the same horse. **Members and parents must recognize that adjustments and/or choices may need to be made to adapt to show conditions or schedules, such as when two members are in the same class, competing for championships, or classes running simultaneously.**

GENERAL REMINDERS

- 4-H is Learning by Doing. 4-H members are encouraged to help each other. All 4-H members are to be in charge of their horse project without assistance from parents and/or trainers at this event (unless there is an emergency or safety issue)
- The Show Committee reserves the right to make any changes in schedule, judges, etc, as deemed necessary, including combining classes with less than four entries, or dividing classes with a large number of entries.
- Unruly, dangerous, uncontrolled, visibly ill, thin or unsound animals may be dismissed from a class and/or the show grounds by the show committee, management or the judge.
- No one shall approach a Judge until he/she first obtains permission from the Show Chair, Show Steward or Show Committee member who shall then arrange an appointment at a proper time and place after all classes are completed for that judge for that day.
- A Show Steward will be in attendance at the show. The Show Steward's role is to protect the interests of the exhibitors, judges and the show management. The Steward is to assist in interpreting rules. The Steward has no authority in managing or judging the competition but is an interested third-party to assist the show.
- All exhibitors are expected to be familiar with all rules governing the classes they have entered. Questions on rules and procedures should be directed to the Show Office or Show Steward for clarification. Do not expect all volunteers helping at the show to know all rules and regulations in depth for any classes.
- Riders are to ride only at their level. W/T and W/J may not practice or warm up at a canter or lope.
- Trail classes can not be scored until all participants have ridden. Riding your trail class early helps results out earlier.
- Any complaints or grievances must be addressed in writing, as outlined with current policies and procedures of the Snohomish County 4-H Horse Program. If you have constructive comments or suggestions about the horse show, you may address your written comments to the 4-H Horse Show Chair; PO Box 148, Snohomish WA 98291.

ABUSE WILL NOT BE TOLERATED AT THIS HORSE SHOW

Snohomish County 4-H Show Management reserves the right to refuse any entry of an exhibitor or the participation of any rider or driver who has been shown to abuse, either physically or verbally, any Horse, Show Personnel, Show Officials, Volunteers or other Exhibitors. Any reported abuse will be investigated, and upon verification by Show Management, the person/persons will be eliminated from further competition at this show, will forfeit all unused fees, and will be barred from the show grounds.

If you are available to volunteer at the show, please sign up via our Sign-Up Genius, which will be posted on the Program Facebook page. The Show is run entirely by volunteers so please help wherever you can. Enrollment as a 4-H Volunteer is NOT required to help!
